Edna M. Bland "Miss Edna" is a certified educator, teaching artist and professional puppeteer, who has honed her craft at The Kennedy Center. Shakespeare's Globe Theater, and Lincoln Center Education's Juilliard School. As a puppeteer, she was mentored by Caroll Spinney, "Big Bird" of Sesame Street, She was honored to be one of the exhibiting artists for the Ballard Institute and Museum's Living Objects: Celebration of African American Puppetry at the University of Connecticut. She also had the privilege to be a puppeteer for the Jim Henson Company-Jane Henson's Nativity for two touring seasons in Central Florida. Edna is the creator of the edutainment brands. Lovely Day Creative Arts. and Sock n' Sew Puppets. In 2021, she was one of the recipients to receive the 400 Distinguished Award by the US Congress commemorating the 400 years of African American History for her work as an educator and

teaching artist serving her community through puppetry. In 2022, she was awarded Theatre Educator of the Year by the Florida Association for Theatre Education and in 2023 was the recipient of the Marjorie Batchelder McFarland Award for her contributions in Puppetry Education and Therapy. Before becoming an educator, Edna worked in the entertainment industry for such companies as The New York Emmy Awards and Sony Music Entertainment's children's label Sony Wonder were she helped produce Sesame Street's 35th Anniversary box set. As an arts advocate she serves as Vice President for the Puppeteers of America and Executive Secretary for the Florida Alliance for Arts Education and a board member for Florida Association for Theatre Education. She also is the Chair for Florida Jr. Thespians District 2, where she supervises all the Jr. theatre troupes in Seminole and Volusia Counties. He is on the peer-review board of Youth Theatre Journal and his work is widely published in journals and edited collections such as Ecumenica: Journal of Theatre and Performance. Theatre Survey. His primary research interrogates the role of performance in the development of evangelical Christianity, from the 18th century to the present. He is the winner of FATE's 2023 Outstanding Administrator Award.
